Assistance applying for a grant (EPA MARC grants and STRP proposals), planning next steps, etc.

CCLR's Menu of Services

Brownfields Trainings and Resources

- Providing training for those who have never worked with brownfields.
- Understanding liability including CERCLA and the Brownfields Law.
- Training on EPA grants and other funding opportunities.
- Providing custom educational workshops or training on topics like grant writing, procurement, grant reporting, etc.
- Online resource center with readily available information, webinar recordings, and documents.

Redevelopment Planning

- Identifying, inventorying, and prioritizing brownfields for redevelopment.
- Creating strategic plans, work plans, and setting goals for property reuse.
- Helping assess and analyze existing plans and conditions to inform area-wide redevelopment plans.
- Evaluate the potential reuse of existing infrastructure; and identify sites that can help spur revitalization and economic development.

Redevelopment Financing: Grant Prep/Management; Procurement

- Identifying funding opportunities and creative financing approaches.
- Developing redevelopment roadmaps and funding matrices.
- Providing guidance and review during brownfields grant application preparation.
- Supporting grant management and programmatic activities including quarterly/annual reporting.
- Assisting with and navigating the procurement process.
- Developing RFPs and RFQs including evaluation criteria and process of selecting contractors or consultants.

Environmental Support

- Interpreting environmental technical reports.
- Assistance with the development of next steps, including brainstorming scope of work for environmental tasks.
- Navigating and interpreting regulatory requirements by facilitating conversations with DEC.
- Help understand the cleanup process.

Stakeholder Engagement

- Facilitating and planning community involvement activities and developing community engagement plans.
- Help with communicating the reuse process, risks, and benefits to community stakeholders.
- Connecting and convening the community with other relevant stakeholders and practitioners including agency officials, consultants, attorneys, and more.
- Assisting with marketing sites, including developing Property Profile Sheets, to third parties interested in purchasing properties.

WHAT IS A BROWNFIELD?

A vacant/underutilized property with potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant, complicating reuse.



Environmental Injustice:

Disproportionate burden of brownfields in disadvantaged, low-income communities.

Pollutants of brownfields are...

- uncontrolled wastewater disposal
- leaking fuel tanks
- asbestos, lead paint, PCBs

Brownfields could be...

- oil drilling sites
- closed dry cleaners
- old civilian federal facilities such as schools and hospitals
- any site with an unknown use history
